

In Wyoming, special districts are the "boots on the ground" for local service delivery. From protecting vast agricultural lands to providing fire protection in rural communities, these districts allow Wyoming residents to manage local resources and services independently and efficiently. Special districts provide services that other local governments either do not or are not able to provide. Wyoming special districts provide local control for local issues.

There are 27 different types of special districts in Wyoming providing vital services to protect the health, safety, and general welfare of its citizens.

According to the U.S. Census Bureau's 2022 Census of Governments, there are 643 special purpose districts in Wyoming. These districts are served by more than 2,350 citizens serving voluntarily on special district boards. They are elected by their local constituents and work to provide essential services to the citizens of Wyoming. Special districts serve the people of Wyoming from birth to burial and everything in between.
